We wanted the auditorium to convey the feeling a dynamic ipple of a water, the circular pattern represents it. The pattern is carved into the wooden slats as a static element and the circular LED light set at various intensities create the dynamism

When is complete lit with all the house lights in a switched on position the Auditorium glows in a blue tone which gradually changes as the stage setting .changes from blues to white.

ENTRANCE LOBBIES & LOUNGE

Spread over the three floors the lobbies lead to various activities within, the lobbies besides forming buffer zones and welcome areas create the first impressions. They can be used a sterile beautiful spaces or create a dynamic vibrance encouraging a dialogue

The external glazing was covered with lazer cut screens which allowed the daylight to seep through and the acted as back-lit, panels minimizing the ceiling lights; while creating the dynamic change of light.

The graphics we attune to the nature of the essence of the iving, ripples in the water which spread (ideas spread) and dynamic movement through the blue graphic all mellowed with capturing the subtle colours in the furniture.

The back end of the atrium was treated in special 3d wall paper plaster which has moves with the eye to create different patterns. The feature ties up the three levels together.




